Friendship English Classes To Start September 9th

Adults who want to learn to speak, understand, read and write English and practical life skills are invited to join us from **9:45AM to 11:30AM on Monday and Wednesday** mornings in the classrooms at the **Good News Bible Church, at 845 Pepperwood Lane** (behind K-Mart). The Broadway bus stops nearby . Classes are <u>free</u>!

Classes will include grammar and life skills lessons, including topics such as talking with your doctor, making an appointment, applying for a job, talking about your family and daily activities, shopping for food and clothing, understanding the kinds of businesses and services in our community, interacting with the police, avoiding identity theft, talking with your child's teacher, and more. Classes will accept new students throughout the fall semester,.

If a class is full, students may be put on a waiting list until a space opens up in the class.

We're sorry, but children may not come to class or be unattended in the building.

Emergencies!

Community ID's for Johnson County Residents

Our county issues community identification cards for Johnson County residents who don't have an ID for common activities like cashing their pay checks, renting an apartment, buying medicine, or showing an ID to a police officer after reporting a crime. You can use the card to:

- · Open a bank account at participating banks
- Confirm your identity when using a credit card.
- · Get a library card
- Interact with schools, city and county agencies, and police
- Participate in some discount programs

You can *not* use this ID to get a driver's license, board an airplane, buy alcohol or tobacco, enter businesses with age restrictions, prove employment eligibility, or vote.

A 4-year ID costs \$8 for adults, \$4 for a child.

To get your card, go to the Johnson County Administration building, 913 S. Dubuque St. in lowa City. You will need to bring some identification with you.

Forms of ID You Can Use to Get A Community ID Card

You will need One of these: *passport

*US driver's license

*US state non-driver's license ID card

*Green Card

*Birth Certificate (kid under age 16)

*Consular ID card

OR two of these:

*National ID card with photo, name, address, date of birth, expiration date

- *Foreign driver's license
- *Voter registration card (with original birth certificate)
- *Military ID card (with original birth certificate)
- *U.S. Individual Taxpayer ID Number ITIN (with a photo ID)
- *ID card from an lowa school
- *Certified copy of birth certificate
- *Social Security Card

You will also need proof of address:

- *Utility bill
- *Insurance bill
- *bank statement
- *Employment stub
- *Mortgage payment receipt
- *Original health or social services document saying you have lived here for 15 days
- *Income tax refund statement
- *Current rental agreement or mobile home lot payment receipt
